



# FIRST AID POLICY

## Mitcham Primary School

### PURPOSE

To ensure the school community understands our school's approach to first aid for students.

### SCOPE

First aid for anaphylaxis and asthma are provided for in our school's:

- *Anaphylaxis Policy.*
- *Asthma Policy.*

This policy does not include information on first aid requirements for COVID-19. Our school follows the Department's operational guidance for first aid management relating to COVID-19.

### POLICY

From time to time Mitcham Primary School staff might need to administer first aid to students at school or school activities.

Parents/carers should be aware that the goal of first aid is not to diagnose or treat a condition.

### Staffing

The principal will ensure that Mitcham Primary School has sufficient staff with the appropriate levels of first aid training to meet the first aid needs of the school community.

Our school's trained first aid officers are listed in our Emergency Management Plan (EMP). Our EMP includes the expiry dates of the training. This is updated annually after the completion of our first aid training.

Mitcham Primary School's first aid coordinator is Lauren Cerra. Mitcham Primary School teaching and support staff are trained in;

- Level 2 First Aid - updated every 3 years.
- CPR - updated yearly.
- Anaphylaxis - updated every 2 years with a 6 month briefing.
- Asthma (teaching staff only) - updated every 3 years.



## **First aid kits**

Mitcham Primary School will maintain:

- A major first aid kit which will be stored in the first aid room.
- Six portable first aid kits which may be used for excursions, camps, or yard duty. The portable first aid kits are stored in the first aid room.
- Small first aid kits are also kept within each building in the school. There are 6 in total. They are kept in:
  - Room 5
  - Room 10
  - Kitchen area in BER
  - Hall
  - Performing Arts Centre
  - STEM centre

Lauren Cerra will be responsible for maintaining all first aid kits.

## **Care for ill students**

Students who are unwell should not attend school.

If a student becomes unwell during the school day they may be directed to the sick bay and monitored by staff. Depending on the nature of their symptoms, staff may contact parents/carers or an emergency contact person to ask them to collect the student.

## **First aid management**

If there is a situation or incident which occurs at school or a school activity which requires first aid to be administered to a student:

- Staff who have been trained in first aid will administer first aid in accordance with their training. In an emergency situation, other staff may assist in the administration of first aid within their level of competence.
- In a medical emergency, staff may take emergency action and do not need to obtain parent/carer consent to do so. Staff may contact Triple Zero “000” for emergency medical services at any time.
- Staff may also contact NURSE-ON-CALL (on 1300 60 60 24) in an emergency. NURSE-ON-CALL provides immediate, expert health advice from a registered nurse and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- If first aid is administered for a minor injury or condition, Mitcham Primary School will notify parents/carers by sending a note home to parents/carers and a phone call if necessary.
- If first aid is administered for a serious injury or condition, or in an emergency situation, school staff will attempt to contact parents/carers or emergency contacts as soon as reasonably practical.



- If staff providing first aid determine that an emergency response is not required but that medical advice is needed, school staff will ask parents/carers, or an emergency contact person, to collect the student and recommend that advice is sought from a medical practitioner.
- Whenever first aid treatment has been administered to a student Mitcham Primary School will:
  - record the provision of care on eduSafe Plus. If the care is provided following a [recorded incident](#), the details are recorded through the eduSafe Plus *Incident* form. For all other presentations, the eduSafe Plus *Sick Bay* form is used.
  - if care was provided in response to a medical emergency or reportable incident, follow the Department's [Reporting and Managing School Incidents Policy](#), including reporting the incident to the Department's Incident Support and Operations Centre on 1800 126 126 where required to under that policy.

In accordance with guidance from the Department of Education and Training, analgesics, including paracetamol and aspirin, will not be stored at school or provided as a standard first aid treatments. This is because they can mask signs of serious illness or injury.
