



UNIFORM POLICY

Mitcham Primary School

RATIONALE

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance and allows them to be seen by the community as part of Mitcham Primary School.

The School recognises that equality, health and safety and expense issues should be considered when establishing or changing the school uniform.

PURPOSE

The School aims to define a uniform dress code that provides choice for the students, allows for the students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial constraints of families.

GUIDELINES

Students should wear uniform that is appropriate and safe for the occasion/activity. The uniform should provide identity, and conform to School Council requirements. The uniform should conform to the requirements of equal opportunity legislation, and be available to all members of the School Community on a cost effective basis. The wearing of the uniform is compulsory during school hours and other designated school activities.

Teachers will use the uniform stamp in the student's diary to notify parents of non-compliance.

Non-compliance will require a written explanation from parents/guardians.
