## STUDENT VOICE AND AGENCY AT MPS

When students are agents in their learning, they are more likely to have 'learned how to learn' – an invaluable skill that they can use throughout their lives.

Following our recent School Review, one of the key improvement strategies we set ourselves as educators at Mitcham Primary School, was to increase student voice and agency at a school and classroom level, to empower students as agents of their own learning. In recent weeks I have been approached by multiple students expressing interest in designing and implementing additional learning opportunities for fellow students. Students have initiated, promoted and recruited for student led clubs in areas they feel are of particular interest to themselves and their peers. We now have the following student led clubs: Geography Club, Crafty Bees Club and Disney Club. The student organisers of these clubs have delivered highly organised and engaging activities. Geography Club recently ran a Sporcle Quiz, challenging students to name all 197 of the countries in the world in less than 15 minutes - they succeed with 40 seconds to spare! Crafty Bees Club made paper pumpkin Halloween decorations on Wednesday and our Disney Club's most recent meeting included a Kahoot Quiz of guessing the Disney songs and rounds of Disney celebrity heads.

Other groups of students across the school have adopted their own project-based investigations into real world needs. Subsequently, they have written to me requesting a forum or event to raise money to support the change or need they have investigated. This initiative has resulted in a student led fundraising Friday afternoon on Friday 11th November. Students have been making handmade items, such as bookmarks, origami animals, pompoms, and bracelets, that they will sell at their stores for a gold coin. Money raised will then be donated to their selected charities. Charities they have nominated include the World Wildlife Fund, National Homeless Collective, The Royal Children's Hospital and Team Seas.

We could not be prouder of these students who are actively directing and taking responsibility for their learning, they have all spent time reflecting and planning actions, and have accepted the responsibilities that come with being a part of solving a problem or making a change. Keep it up MPS students!

## 2023 CLASS PLACEMENTS

As I mentioned in a previous newsletter, plans for 2023 are well underway. Currently, our teachers are starting to construct classes for next year. It is a long and arduous process as teachers try very hard to get the right balance.

Students are placed by staff in class groupings best suited to their learning needs. Many factors are considered to create classes that are balanced and so friendships alone are not the main factor. These factors include:

- a spread of mixed ability students in every class (i.e., students working at the same level academically)
- a range of learning styles
- social and emotional needs
- friendships
- a good mix of students from previous classes
- students who require extra support to access the curriculum
- other relevant individual needs.

The process is about creating positive learning communities across the school for everyone's benefit. Most teachers would have had conversations with parents throughout the course of the year and are aware of additional issues that need to be considered in placing students in classes. We do not take requests for specific teachers.

Next year, we will be welcoming several new families to Mitcham Primary School, similarly fare welling some lovely families. If you know that your children will not be returning in 2023, we request that you let the office know as soon as possible, so that we can finalise our planning for 2023.

# CLASSROOM SNEAK PEEKS: CYCLE 3

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
This term has seen the Montessori grade 6 students presenting their 'Great Work'. For the Great Work, students choose a topic of personal interest to study for the year.

Hello Mitcham Primary School Community

We would like to introduce you to Eastern Food Rescue.

Around 40 volunteers along with our founder Emma Tucker, collect food and non-perishables from over 70 locations around Melbourne per week. Our main purpose is to prevent good food from going to landfill and it is rescued from a variety of sources such as local cafés, bakeries and supermarkets.

Any food that is not suitable for consumption is composted. We also have a generous community member who takes the compost to their farm to feed his animals and nourish his soil. Any community member is welcome to take the compost as well as add to it.

Our pantry at 8-12 Simla St, is regularly stocked by our committed volunteers; anyone in the community is welcome to take food that is stored there. We hold regular pop-up mini markets at this location most weekdays and evenings. There is also a weekend market at Antonio Park Primary School every Saturday and Sunday 11.30-12.30pm just outside the reception, where we give away the food and non-perishables that we have collected.

We at Eastern Food Rescue love helping our community and would like to advise that from halfway through term 1 of this year 2022 we have been delivering free fruit and bread to your school every Monday. I hope your children have been enjoying the fruit and bread and may have come home to tell you about it.

Eastern Food Rescue celebrated its anniversary on 21 August 2022, marking the charity's first year. We have received much positive feedback and messages of appreciation from the community and we hope to continue to serve you and work together towards a cleaner planet.
